EMERGENCY LIGHTS

Operation of Emergency Lighting Should operate in total mains failure or local lighting failure (e.g. A breaker trips).

Maintained or Non Maintained:-

Non Maintained light operate only when their supply fails.

Maintained lights may be on all the time. Note: Maintained lights may be switched on and off with the normal lighting but come on if their supply fails.

Testing Emergency Lighting to BS5266

Daily-Indicators show that the main supply is connected

Monthly-Short duration test, simulate mains failure and confirm the lamp lights

Annually-Full duration test, simulate mains failure and confirm the lamp lights and remains lit for the full duration (3 Hours). Check that the batteries charge normally.

Record any test in the logbook!

MCFP carry out two six monthly services of the emergency lights for up to one hour. Any lights that fail within this period will be recorded for repair or replacement.

The annual three hour test is a recent modification to the BS5266 routine. We will be pleased to carry out this service for you, although it may have to be scheduled on Saturday morning or an early evening test. The lights require 12 hours to re-charge the batteries before staff return to work and are subjected to periods of darkness with dis-charged emergency lights.
